Common sources & how to find source information

For most electronic subscription sites (such as iConn, Facts on File, & Encyclopedia Britannica), look at the bottom of the article then compare with examples and what is required.

Database:

Journal with volume & issue

Author. "Article Title." *Journal* Volume.Issue (Year): Pages*. *Database Name*. Web. Date you looked at article.

Magazine, Newspaper, or Book

Last Name, First. "Article Title." *Magazine, Newspaper, or Book Title* Date: Pages*. *Database Name*. Web. Date of Access.

(*Use n. pag. If no pages are numbered. Always abbreviate Month)
